The juror, George Lepp, selected 49 images from the 164 entries and chose the award winners.

The following artists received cash prizes: Alexander Depue, Best of Show for *Morro*; Bob Canepa, 1st Place for *Stormy Immigration*; Kabe Russell, 2nd Place for *Night Fall*; Jeff Campbell, 3rd Place for Untitled; Gary O'Neill, Honorable Mention for *Wave Nu 1*; Pat Brown, Honorable Mention for *Shazam*; Alexander Depue, Honorable Mention for *Hedda Gabler*; and Craig B. Kincaid, Honorable Mention for *Looking Up Liberty*.

Mr. Lepp added this remark, "The variety of subjects and techniques will appeal to photographers and non-photographers. There is a lot to see and take in!" Congratulations to all the participants and the organizers of *New Visions 2017*. ◆


Brushstrokes Opens May 19

In conjunction with The Painters Group, the Museum of Art presents *Brushstrokes 2017*, a biennial juried painting exhibition on view in the Gray Wing from May 19–July 2, 2017. This year's exhibition was open to painters across California.

Exhibition juror David Limrite selected 53 paintings from 241 images submitted. In his Juror's Statement, Mr. Limrite explained, "I chose work that, for me, best represents mature and accomplished expressions of creativity, art making and mastery of the chosen medium. I looked for work that exhibited the highest quality, in terms of execution and craftsmanship. I chose work that displayed consistency and strength in the foundations of picture making including: value, color, shape, texture, edge quality, mark-making and drawing skill. I was particularly interested in work that was spatially well organized and strong in design and composition."

David Limrite received a degree in fine art from San Diego State University and a degree in illustration from Art Center College of Design. He taught drawing and painting at Art Center College of Design and at the Brentwood Art Center where he was also the Director of Education for twenty-three years.

Mr. Limrite is a practicing artist who also teaches workshops and coaches other artists. He will be leading an Art at High Noon tour of *Brushstrokes* on Thursday, June 1 at 12 PM, as well as teaching an adult three-day workshop entitled "Oil Paint Stick Bootcamp" at SLOMA beginning on June 2, 2017.

Patricia Griffin: By The Sea May 5–July 2



Patricia Griffin is an expressive ceramist whose unique work captures the natural beauty of the Central Coast. Griffin's new body of artwork features colorful graphic interpretations of plants, animals, and rhythms of Griffin's natural environment. The Museum of Art is looking forward to showcasing By The Sea: Ceramics by Patricia Griffin from May 5 – July 2. Ten years ago, Ms. Griffin

moved to Cambria and made the transition to full-time artist. She continues to perfect her individual style and *sgraffito* technique. Sgraffito (in Italian "to scratch") is produced by applying layers of color to pottery and then scratching off parts of the layers to create contrasting images, patterns, and texture to reveal the clay color underneath. It didn't take long for Ms. Griffin's ceramics to be shown in exhibitions across the country.

A public opening of the exhibition will take place on Friday, May 5 from 6–9 PM, in conjunction with Art After Dark. Ms. Griffin will give a demonstration of her *sgraffito* technique. Admission is free and open to the public. ◆

For fifty years, the Museum of Art has sponsored an annual countywide High School Art Portfolio Competition between Mother's Day and Memorial Day. All high school art teachers are encouraged to have their junior and senior art students participate.

SLOMA's focus for this longstanding event is to reward the efforts of young art students and give them the opportunity to exhibit their artwork in a museum setting. The event also adds practical experince in preparing a portfolio that will help as they embark on higher learning or a career.

An opening reception for the students, their art teachers and families is on Thursday, May 18, 4–6 pm in the Nybak Wing. \$1,000 in cash prizes will be shared by the top students, and at least one piece by every student is shown in the exhibit.

enlisting the fashion house Givenchy to create couture gowns for each model. \blacklozenge




